Dear LUMC Family,

One of the things we talked about at the start of 2025, as a church, was the markers of spiritual vitality. Our conference did some research based off of Harvard's study on the markers of human flourishing to ask, what are the markers of congregational flourishing? They landed on Clarity, Joy, Kinship, Witness, and Abundance.

One of those markers, in particular, is an interesting one to measure: kinship. Things like Abundance, Clarity, and Witness can be measured with some obvious external measures, but how do you measure the kinship among the congregation? Number of people who show up early and stay late to church, how close people sit next to each other on a Sunday, how many people at church actually like each other? Those could all work, but one that I think really captures the spiritual vitality of a church is "Buzz." Have you ever walked into a place that is just buzzing? There is just an energy that can capture you.

I've already shared a lot about getting to go to Homeboy Industries in California, but I want to share one more story. If you don't know, Homeboy was a ministry that was started in the late 80s to help folks get out of the gang life that was plaguing that part of California at the time. Over the years, they've helped reduce the number of gang-related deaths from over 1,000 per year to somewhere around 200. The work they have done is incredible. One of the key things they do every day, right around 9:00 a.m., is called Morning Meeting, where they walk through all the things that are available for the day for the clients who come through. That does not sound very exciting, right? Wrong.

The place was buzzing. It was packed full—almost 200 people crammed into a tiny lobby space. As they went through the agenda, it was almost like a call-and-response liturgy. They shouted out people hitting major milestones, from getting off parole to finishing their master's degree. At one point, a guy interrupted to share a story about his friend who had fought and won his first boxing match, and how appreciative he was for him. The two met in prison. He shared how he was the only one pushing him to make smarter choices in his life. He shared how, "he not only stopped me from taking my life, but helped give me life to the fullest." Everyone cheered. The place was abuzz.

As I stood there, I remember thinking, it's not all that different from what takes place here during the week. Okay, maybe the people and the problems are a bit different, but the same spiritual buzzing takes place. If you want to experience it, come join us for M&Ms and Youth one Wednesday.

That spiritual buzzing doesn't come from anything other than our mindset. When we volunteer for M&Ms or Youth, it can be easy to get frustrated with the messes and the noise. And believe me, it gets loud and messy. But what a blessing that is for our church. Thank God that we get the opportunity to clean up those messes with those kids.

It's not about numbers either. I remember one Sunday around the holidays where attendance at both services was pretty low. Lots of folks out of town and traveling. You'd think when that happens it would feel uncomfortable, silent, awkward. Nope, not here. It was buzzing. People were visiting before the service like old friends who hadn't seen each other in decades. You couldn't pry people away from each other during the meet and greet.

That spirit of kinship was present. When it comes down to it, it's about the mindsets we have. For the first few weeks of the year, I want us to think about those mindsets. Because there are a few things that can take us from seeing those things as blessings to seeing them as burdens. They are the things that, if we're not careful, can sneak up and take over our thinking. Don't fall prey to these wrong mindsets, and instead discover with us how we can live the words of Paul in Colossians 3:2 and "set our minds on the things that are above." Blessings, Pastor Chris




for all our M&M volunteers to help prepare for the new year. Hope to see you there. If you have any questions, reach out to Pastor Chris.
