#### Dear LUMC Family,

Let me tell you about the most faithful evangelist of LUMC since I have been here. They've never missed a Sunday, they're always here for M&Ms and Youth. They never complain; they're always there to greet you before church, through rain, heat & humidity, snow, and storms - they are always present. They've stood as a part of the church for countless years.

Out of guesses? It's the basketball hoop in front of the FLC. Now, you may be surprised, but let me tell you the story. Over the last year, several groups of boys have been playing basketball at various times in front of the church. I'll drive by on a Friday morning in the summer, and I'll see a few boys playing. Sometimes, I walk over to the FLC on a Saturday to prepare for Sunday, and there they are playing. I came out of church at 10:30, and there they were playing.

Now, you might say to me, Chris, 'They should be in church listening, not outside of church playing.' But I'm just glad they feel comfortable enough to play. What a gift it is that they think of this church as a place where they can come.

One day, a few of them were playing last spring on a Wednesday around 6:00pm. All our Youth had wrapped up, and there was just a small group of us there for confirmation. Some of our students who knew the group of kids leaving popped up and told them they needed to come in to church and invited them to confirmation class. "We have snacks," they said, as the key to their sales pitch. Now, to confess, I was a bit annoyed. We had a lot of material to get through and not a lot of time to do it. I don't need kids who aren't part of this class making it a distraction rather than finishing what we need to discuss.

Boy, was I wrong. In Mark 5, Jesus is asked by Jairus, the leader of a synagogue (i.e., a pastor), to heal his daughter. She's dying, and Jarius knows that Jesus is his only hope, and time is of the essence. While he and Jesus are on the way there, an unnamed woman comes up to Jesus, who, like Jairus' daughter, is also ill and suffering and in need of Jesus. Jesus stops his journey to Jairus' house to tend to this woman. I have to imagine if you're Jairus, you're shouting at Jesus like, "We have to get up and go! What are you waiting for? We have no time for this!" For Jairus, this isn't the time for interruptions. While Jesus is tending to this other woman, a report comes from the house that Jairus' daughter had passed. Maybe, just maybe, if they had made it there faster, Jesus could have healed her in time, is what I imagine Jairus thought. To all of us, our best laid plans are well-intentioned. But the good news is that God's plans are always better than our plans. And in the end, God always makes a way. Jairus' daughter is healed by Jesus, in a miracle he couldn't have even ever imagined. Going back to that confirmation class. What I thought would derail a really well-thought-out lesson, if I do say so myself, actually became one of our most fruitful conversations. As we discussed as a group, the importance of being part of a church. Kids who had grown up their whole lives in LUMC, kids whose first time entering a church was in that moment.

As of this year, a number of those kids have moved from playing basketball outside to joining us inside for Youth. They eat, play games, listen to the lesson, and become a part of this church. Part of the beauty of it and part of the real, long, slow work of ministry to kids and Youth is the reminder that you never know what's going on in their lives. Yes, we teach them about Jesus, and that work is essential. But, we also get to model Jesus' love and grace to them.

A kid here might be a little loud, a little rowdy, and they might spill their food and drink. But the church might be the only place they can do that without the threat of abuse. A kid may have come in here because they were walking home with a friend, when a parent was too drunk and forgot to pick them up.

These are real issues, real stories, real moments out kids face. Part of the power of our ministry each week is that we get to show them the hope that there's a different way of life. There's a hope in the hard times, and his name is Jesus.

Lexington United Methodist Church celebrated Matt Everett with a beautiful reception.




