Dear LUMC Family.

"Don't miss it," I wrote on a Post-it note and placed it inside my notebook. Last month, I was in Arkansas doing some continuing education. Our facilitator asked us what we needed to give ourselves permission for when we were back at work to still be our best selves. It could take some time to check your email; it could be to try something you didn't want to try. Anything was on the table.

It took me a little time. I can often get so caught up in the business of what's going on, my work to-do list, Sunday's sermon, and preparing for M & Ms that I miss what's going on around me.

Luke 10:38-42 always convicts me. In the story, Martha gets so caught up in preparing for Jesus that she MISSES Jesus showing up. It can be valid for many of us that we get so caught up in the preparation for this season that we miss the meaning of this season.

We spend so much time setting up for the Christmas party that we don't enjoy the folks we had the party for. We spend so much time fretting over gifts that we don't enjoy giving a loved one a gift. We worry so much about attending all the Christmas programs that we don't want them. We get so caught in the bustle of the Christmas season, that we don't stop to remember and take from the reason for the season. In short, we miss it.

As Jesus said about the sabbath, we weren't made for the Christmas season; the Christmas season was made for us. All the stuff we do should help point us TO the reason. It should direct our hearts to look more like Jesus. I invite you to permit yourselves this Christmas season not to miss it. Please don't get caught up in all the needless demands of Christmas we place on ourselves.

Instead, think about how we can simplify Christmas. How can we make this a time of joy and celebration with our family? How can this be a time of strengthening our faith as a part of this church? How can I share the love and generosity that Christ calls me to day in and day out?

When we give ourselves that reminder not to miss it, I wonder what will change in us. For once, we won't feel like we're slogging through a busy season; instead, we will feel like we're taking it all in. We won't feel like we're waiting for this commitment to be over; instead, we will take joy in the things we are a part of.

What would look different if you were committed not to miss it?
