Dear LUMC Family,

What is your favorite Easter memory? Maybe it occurred when you were a kid and involved in an egg hunt at church. Perhaps the food and family took place at an easter meal after worship. It may be more recent and involves your family being together for worship, despite the chaos it may have taken to get everywhere dressed and ready.

I have a few fond memories of Easter. One of my earliest memories was making Easter Eggs with classmates at the local United Methodist day school. I still remember the strong smell of vinegar and my dismay when my egg didn't quite turn out as colorful as I hoped. A more recent memory I think back on is the sunrise service we'd do at my last church in Galveston. We'd get out there early in the morning while it was still dark, much like the disciples do on Easter morning. And we'd get everything set up. One year there was a woman who was upset we'd be having a church service out there because it would be "too loud" and she wanted to go back to bed after her walk. We assured her that we had all the necessary permits from the city, had done this for a while, and had never received a noise complaint. This, however, did not appease her concerns. We tried to take the high road as Jesus would and invited her to come back around 7 and see what it was all about. She did in fact come back, with bread. Hoping to, and I quote, "throw it on the ground and attract seagulls to shoo everyone away." We joked about that one for years. But that was always such a wonderful service. We had hundreds of folks who would come out to worship with us. And it was such a great way to start Easter.

However, I must admit that I often found myself preoccupied with what was to come rather than fully immersing myself in the celebration. My mind was consumed with thoughts of my Easter sermon, the logistics of getting back to the church on time, the number of attendees, the possibility of something going wrong, the arrangement of the church, the availability of communion supplies, and even the lady who threatened to disrupt our service by throwing bread. Upon reflection, I realized I had been missing out on the beautiful things God was doing in those moments of worry.

It reminds me of that great moment in Luke 10, Jesus and the disciples were coming to Martha's home. Martha has a sister named Mary who instead of helping with the preparations, cleaning the house, washing the sheets, vacuuming, sweeping, cooking, cleaning, tidying, etc. sat at Jesus' feet to listen to his teachings. Martha, scripture tells us, was "distracted by all the preparations that had to be made" (Luke 10:40) goes to Jesus and complains to him asking him to ask her sister to start helping.

Martha was so busy preparing to receive Jesus into her home that she missed Jesus showing up. How much in our preparation for something? Do we miss out on it actually happening? Have you ever hosted some friends at your house, and by the time you get to the end of the night, you realize you barely spoke with them since you were so busy preparing for them? It is easy for us to get caught up in our preparation and miss the actual moment.

This Lenten season, as we prepare to celebrate the resurrection! I invite you not to be like Martha and miss out on Jesus because you're busy preparing for Jesus. The food can wait a little longer, the house can be dirty, and the placemats can be imperfect. Because what matters is how you and I serve and worship a risen savior!
